Terah fathered Abram, Nahor, and Haran; and Haran fathered Lot. 28 Haran died in the presence of his father Terah in the land of his kindred, in Ur of the Chaldeans. 29 And Abram and Nahor took wives. The name of Abram's wife was Sarai, and the name of Nahor's wife, Milcah, the daughter of Haran the father of Milcah and Iscah. 30 Now Sarai was barren; she had no child. 31 Terah took Abram his son and Lot the son of Haran, his grandson, and Sarai his daughter-in- law, his son Abram's wife, and they went forth together from Ur of the Chaldeans to go into the land of Canaan, but when they came to Haran, they settled there. 32 The days of Terah were 205 years, and

- 4. **Read Hebrews 11:13-16**. What are the ways you may tempted to get tied down by the things of this world? How does the example of Abraham motivate you to live like a stranger and exile in this world?
- 5. **Read Psalm 147.** No matter what the external circumstances may be in your life right now, what are some reasons that you have to worship the Lord and to proclaim his greatness?
