APPLICATION QUESTIONS

- 1. **Read John 9:2-3**. What are some of the overly simplistic understandings of suffering you have encountered in your life and in our culture? How can this passage help us think in a deeper and more accurate way about suffering?
- 2. How can this brief question and answer between Jesus and his disciples change your perspective on suffering in the coming weeks?
- 3. **Read 2 Corinthians 12:7-10**. Paul speaks of how God used suffering in profound ways in his own life and ministry. On a personal level, how have you seen this happen?
- 4. Read Romans 8:18. How can considering the future removal of suffering impact your perspective this week?
- 5. **Read 2 Corinthians 4:4-6.** When God opened your eyes through salvation, what are some of the things you can see now that you couldn't see before? These could be truths about God and his word, aspects of his character, realities of life/death, etc.
