- 3. Of the five things that were discussed as "finished" in this sermon, which one sticks out to you the most? Pick a verse to memorize this week that will help you meditate on that point.
- 4. **Read Colossians 2:13-15**. What are some ways Christians can wrongly process guilt and shame? How can remembering the reality of what was accomplished on the cross help us process those things rightly?
- 5. **Read Hebrews 2:14-15.** What are some ways you might be tempted to fear death, and how should the death of Christ take away that fear?
