4. **Read Ecclesiastes 2:18-26**. While your work and your home will feel the effects of Genesis 3 this week, how should the grace we find in Christ change our perspective from despair to one of joy this week?

5. **Read Revelation 22:1-5**. What excites you most about this future scene of renewed fellowship with God in heaven? How should this reality encourage or challenge you this week?
