APPLICATION QUESTIONS

2. **Read Romans 8:28**. What are some of the ways you have seen this be true in your life? Why is it still often hard to trust that God will use even seemingly bad things for the good of believers?

3. **Read Lamentations 3:16-27**. What about Jeremiah's example here can be helpful to you when you are looking at those proverbial "puzzle pieces" that really just don't seem to fit with what you thought life or God's plan would look like?

4. **Read Psalm 131**. What are some of the things that most disturb the "calm" and "quiet" in your soul? What are some of the things you have learned from this passage/message that can help you restore that contentment in your soul?

5. **Read Ecclesiastes 3:12**. Think specifically about the next week – especially your job, your home, and your relationships. What are some ways you can "do good" in these arenas this week no matter what season you are in?
