4. Read James 1:6-7. Have you ever doubted that God will supply what you ask for? How can you grow to ask your Father in heaven more confidently?

5. Are you tempted to put too much stock in your possessions or the balance in your bank account? If yes, then how? How can you shift your focus from those things to your eternal destination?
